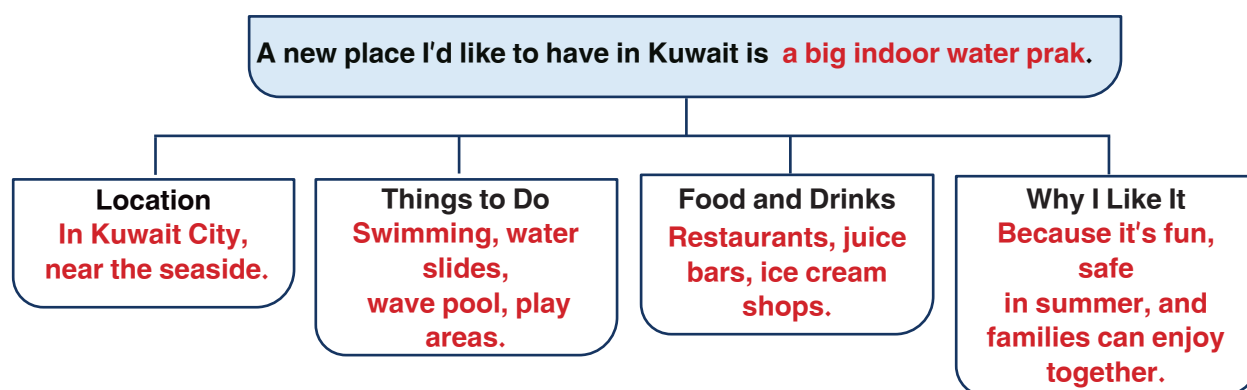

- The Present Simple tense is one of the most basic tenses in English. It is mainly used to talk about habits, facts, general truths, and routines.

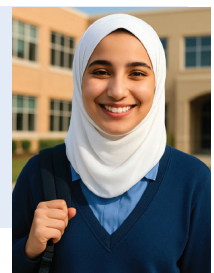

The Present Continuous tense

- The Present Continuous tense describes actions happening now or around now.

Affirmative

- We use am/is/are + verb(-ing) to form the Present Continuous.

- نستخدم (am / is / are) + الفعل بإضافة ing لتكوين زمن المضارع المستمر.



Examples

- She is reading a book now.

Negative

- am/is/are + not + verb(-ing).

- النفي يكون باستخدام ing + الفعل + am/is/are + not.



Examples

- She is not sleeping.

- هي لا تنام.
