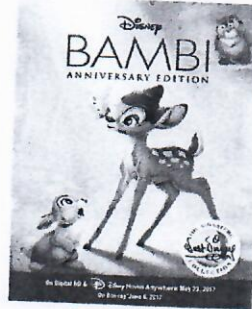
Everybody knows that there are some adult movies that don't spread nice manners or behaviour, but what about other cartoons that are displayed all the day long for young children?

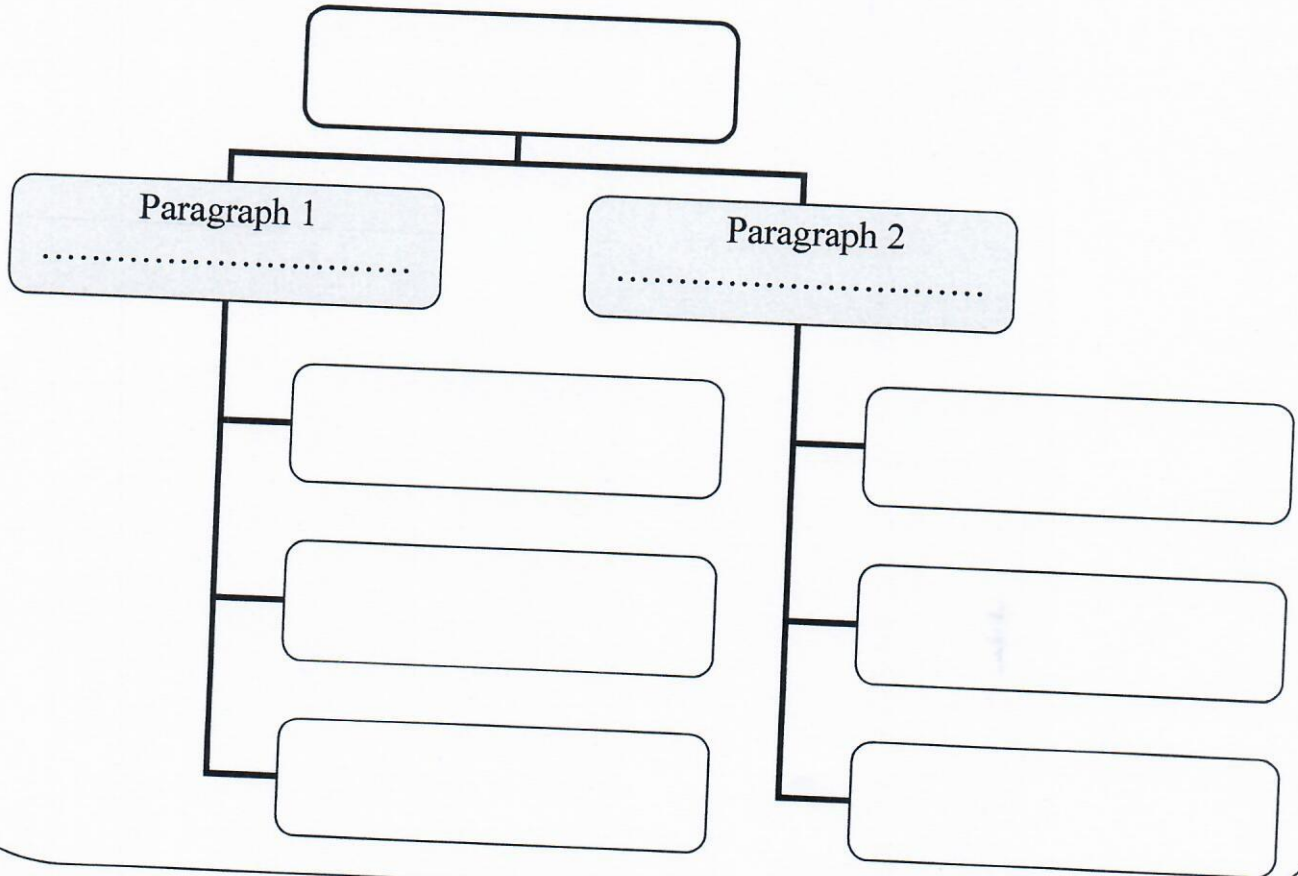
